D. How Does It Work?

F. Suggested Clinical Dosage

Ji Liu Ping comes in pill form. Patients take 6 pills of the formula twice a day for the first 3 weeks. For maintenance, patients may cut down the dose after consulting with the herbalformich. We suggest taking the herbal formula half an hour after eating with warm water. Ice, shellfish, spicy foods, alcohol, caffeine are prohibited upon taking the formula.

We suggest taking this formula from day 5 to day 25 of the period cycle during the abdomen mass therapy. For patients who wish to get pregnant, this formula is not advisable after ovulation time. For patients who have heavy breathing and hemorrhaging during menstruation, it is necessary to add additional herb formula to prevent anemia and hemorrhage. 1. What is endometriosis?

Endometriosis is a disorder in which endometrial cells, which looks and acts like the normal cells that line the uterus, are found in different areas of the body. The most common are is the pelvic area. At the beginning of the menstrual cycle, the endometrial cells outside the uterus responds to the hormones released during menstruation. Furthermore, the location of the endometrial cells swells and bleeds during the first part of the cycle. As a defense against the swelling, the body forms a scar tissue surrounding the cells which may also become red or swollen. As the scar tissue increases, it forms adhesions covering the abdominal organ which affects its normal functions.

The only symptoms that may be found in endometriosis are infertility and pain. The severity of the symptoms, if present, depends mainly on the location of the implants and the depth of its penetration into the normal tissues.

2. How does acupuncture help treat endometriosis?

Acupuncture treat endometriosis divide into two different schedule.

- from day 3 to 20 of the menstrual cycle, the treatment focuses on shrinking the abnormal endometrial cell growing. TCM calls this "removing the qi and blood statis". Herbal formula Ji Liu Ping can be used at this time to reduce the abdominal swelling and control the abnormal endometrial growth by estrogen stimulant For women who would like to be pregnant, this herbal formula is recommended to use from day 3 to 12 and should not be used after the ovulation time.

- from day 21 to day 2 of the menstrual cycle, the treatment is focused on prevention of PMS, menstrual cramps, and abdominal bloating since patients suffering from endometriosis have serve menstruation pain and heavy blood clots. Acupuncture also helps patients relieve symptoms such as nausea, headache, Lower back pain, fatieue, etc.

-Fertility care: Since pregnancy is a good solution to heal endometriosis, acupuncture is very useful to support the patients fertility function. The treatment follows the patients' menstrual cycle to help the healthy follicle growing and fluent ovulation successful conception and safety carrying. Acupuncture also helps women have healthy breast feeding after labor since longer breast feeding will also be the treatment therapy to heal the endometrial system. - Support treatment for the surgery: Some endometriosis patients need surgery care when the symptoms are very severe. Laporoscopy is the major operation that is applied to the patients. Since endometriosis is caused by abnormal hormone growing, some will have reincurrence after the surgery. TCM believes patients need regular acupuncture and herbal treatment after the surgery to prevent the reincurrence rate. Clinical report showed that this preventive care is very important and successful to cut down to reincurrence rate.

3. How does the Chinese herbal formula, Ji Liu Ping, work?

A. What is this formula for?

This herbal formula helps patients who suffer from heavy bleeding, severe pain during ovulation and menstruation, irregular period, bloated abdomen, ache and soreness in the back, as well as infertility due to the different abdomen mass.
